ADOPTION STATEMENT: OCTOBER 2021

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended) that a Developer Contributions Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was formally adopted by Vale of White Horse District Council on 01 October 2021.

The Developer Contributions SPD provides detail on the Council's approach to securing developer contributions, both financial and non-financial, from development to mitigate the negative impacts of development, address infrastructure needs and meet Local Plan policy requirements.

The SPD has been the subject of public consultation and has been modified pursuant to section 23(1) of the Planning and Compulsory Act 2004, to take into account representations made in relation to the draft document. This document will take effect from 1 November 2021, when it will replace the *Vale of White Horse Developer Contributions (Delivering Infrastructure to Support Development) SPD, June 2017*.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision. Any such application must be made promptly and, in any event, not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted.
